## FROM THE PASTOR

September is here and that means the church building is going to get busier. Lots of ministry happened in the summer, but much of it has taken place outside the walls of the church — Bible camp, book group, bible study, Women's events and more has been happening. Now we're ready to kick off another school year of ministry. It's going to get busier. Look for some new programs especially the youth group for elementary aged children. This will be in addition to Sunday school and family ministry activities. We would like to build relationships and fellowship among the children of this age. If you would like to help, there will be many ways to be involved.

You will note from the council minutes that Grace was asked by Lutheran Social Services to temporarily use our building for a neighborhood ministry for school age children. which currently meets at Hilltop United Methodist Church. That congregation is having to do some foundation repairs because of water leaking (sound familiar ) and some roof repairs and so the space the program uses will not be ideal. The Council approved moving forward on exploring this, contingent on their licensing. The council thought that we should do this since it serves our neighbors and a partner ministry. However, LSS was NOT able to get the temporary licensing to use Grace, so the program will NOT be here this fall. LSS is very grateful, though, that we were willing to do this. Pray for their program that things go smoothly while their space is being repaired.

Thanks! The ELCA Churchwide Assembly met in August and passed several memorials, quite a few of which addressed reaching out to neighbors especially those in need. One that has been in the news relates to being a sanctuary denomination. There has been some misinformation out there about this memorial. The ELCA has long been a church that has reached out to serve immigrants and refugees. ELCA Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and SD Synod Bishop David Zeltzer have provided helpful information about what this memorial means for our denominations and for congregations. Copies of their pastoral letters are on the information table. A summary report of the Churchwide Assembly is also available there.

We Lutherans are a *big tent* church. We find members along the whole spectrum when it comes to social matters. But we agree on the power of grace and that God gifts everyone with grace and love in order to draw them into the kingdom. We all serve one Lord to the best of our abilities. God uses each one of us and it is He who brings the kingdom. As we begin another ministry year at Grace I encourage you to think about how you want to be involved in growing your faith and serving your neighbor through the many opportunities that are in our congregation.

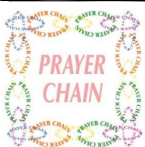

**Secretary's Report** was approved.

**Old Business:** God's Work-Our Hands Sunday is Rally Day, September 8. We plan to collect classroom hygiene supplies for Cleveland, hold the picnic, have a garden produce exchange, car wash, and prayer station again. Sunday school will start at 9:15 with one worship at 10:30. Long Range Planning update: small groups getting input are finishing up and the whole committee will meet at the end of August to pull things together.

**New Business:** Next month budget worksheets will be handed out to begin planning for next year. Roger can give detailed and updated expense reports for those who would like. Bishop Installation service is Saturday, September 7 at 2:00 pm at Gloria Dei Lutheran. It is open to all, but Synod would like RSVPs for planning purposes. Planning Calendars for 2019-2020 were included in Council packet. If you have items to add, let Pastor Siri know.

**LSS proposal:** LSS would like to use Grace as a temporary location for the afterschool program currently at Hilltop Methodist which is experiencing water problems and needing to do roof repair. The anticipated time frame is end of August through January 2020. Many of the children attend Cleveland and walk to the program which is targeted to children whose families couldn't afford such a program. The consensus was that we should help out our neighbors and partner ministry. They would like to start by August 22 when school starts so the council voted to authorize Jeff Eckhoff and Pastor Siri Sorenson to move forward with LSS and enter into a use agreement. All expenses will be paid by LSS including any damage. They will do daily custodial duties. They understand that the space is already used on some days by other groups and they accommodate funerals.

**Treasurer's Report:** Total Deposits through July 31, were \$206,698.42. Expenses for same period \$214,359.82. Checking account balance end of July was \$32.05. Payroll taxes / Benevolences up to date. We had to borrow \$6,390.00 in June and \$2,800.00 in July from the Berg Fund. In June we paid a quarterly insurance payment. Giving is down in the summer. Talked about the church van and wondered if we need to keep it, since it is not being used at this time. Will do some exploring and put this on the agenda for September.

**Pastor's Report:** Submitted written report. June and July activities included: 2 funerals, care for those in need, planning for fall, setting up a Bread Sunday with Bread Break, and taking two weeks of vacation.

**Evangelism Committee:** Met with Long Range Planning subcommittee to provide input for future.

**Worship:** Asked for feedback on not ushering out and will continue this into the fall. Planned picnic for Rally Day. Also reported on the upcoming Golf Outing. Any proceeds will go to the new Elementary Youth Group and Toilet Paper Challenge.

**Stewardship:** Did not meet.

**Women of Grace:** Had breakfast on August 1. Held at the church at a later time and attendance was up significantly. Planning for Soup and Pie on October 6. Ticket prices will be the same. Elicited feedback on where to give the proceeds and the Women's Executive Board will decide from the suggestions given.

**Communications and Tech:** Get screen announcements to Becky by Wednesday so she has time to make them and preview them. Sign up on-line is working. It's a slow process and she encourages all who call to give people the link so they can get used to doing it. At least get peoples' emails so they will get the reminders. Will begin mid-month email blasts again and will include volunteers needed. Preparing a slide show for Rally Day highlighting all that happened over the summer.

**Music Ministry:** Choir schedule will be out this week. Replaced some chimes and mic chords. Working on improving Facebook sound quality. New Grace Alive liturgy is well received so will include that in worship service rotations. Have a tentative plan for Christmas Music Sunday.

**Faith and Family:** Written Report submitted. Met with LRP group to provide input. Had a very successful VBS under the theme "God's Game Plan." Working on getting the Elementary Youth Group going with interested parents. Did calendar planning for upcoming school year.

**Parish Nurse:** Written report submitted. Took some time to go to Baltimore. Attended two funerals.

**Youth and Young Adult:** Written report submitted. Attended camps with MS and HS youth. Upcoming events noted. Will start seminary classes on September 4.

**Church & Society:** Filled 40 backpacks for Ideal with some extra supplies. Dick Neish will deliver next week. Will begin collecting for TP Challenge

**Property:** Written Report submitted. Need some new volunteers to help with Memorial Garden. Going to key game and prop rooms.

## ADULT EDUCATION AND FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

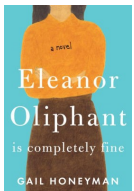

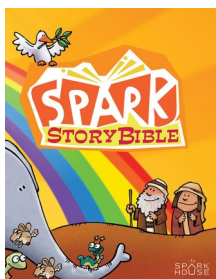
