One of the themes of Epiphany is that Jesus comes for the whole world. As the magi from the east travel to find the baby, we discover that he is not just the promised one for the Jewish people, but for all. The heavens themselves proclaim that Jesus has come. And so, during the season of Epiphany, we will be singing a global hymn each week. These hymns have been included in the ELW. They may not be familiar to us, but they will help us to connect with our brothers and sisters in faith across the globe. God has drawn us all together into one community, the body of Christ.

Epiphany is also a season when we learn who Jesus is and what he means for us. So the gospel readings in January tell us about him from God naming him *Beloved Son* at his baptism, to John the Baptist pointing him out as the Lamb of God, to the disciples discovering that he is the Master they are called to follow. Jesus leads them into the world that they might share him with all they meet.

We, too, live in the life of the Beloved Son also called sons and daughters of God. We, too, are called to point to Jesus as the Lamb of God who forgives sins that others might know grace. Devotions: Led by Vice President Christine Verba for the Executive Committee; devotions in January will be Pastor Siri Sorenson

Secretary's Report: Corrections noted: Becky Smith attended the October conference, not Lisa Jasmer. More explanation was asked about the evangelism report regarding having ushers and greeters be more hospitable. This was not meant to reflect and inhospitality present, but was related to learnings from the hospitality conference on how we can better use people to be even more welcoming of visitors. MSC to accept the report as corrected.

Old Business: 1. Reminder that Annual Reports are due December 15. 2. Reminder that Annual Meeting is set for January 26 at noon with lunch served prior. 3. Received a draft report from the Long Range Planning Committee which outlined the process for getting feedback and priorities for the coming years. These included priorities in the areas of Connecting to the World, Youth Involvement, Growing Spiritually, Facilities, Leadership, and Connecting People. Long Range Priorities Plan will be an item at the Annual Meeting.

New Business: 1. MSC to approve the revised Choir Director job description forward from the Personnel Committee. We will advertise the position on our website and Facebook page, through the SD Synod email newsletter, at Augustana University, the University of Sioux Falls, and through professional networks. 2. The Annual Meeting agenda will include voting on a process for having an advanced line of credit so that if a suitable property becomes available for increased parking, the congregation is able to move in a timely manner.

Treasurer: Total deposits through November 30, 2019 were \$329,101.87. Expenses for the same period were \$335,533.65. Checking account balance at the end of November was \$12.50. Payroll taxes and Benevolences are up to date. We had to borrow \$1,725.00 from the Berg Fund.

Pastor Siri: Written report submitted. Had meetings with Personnel Committee, music staff, Long Range planning committee this month. Presided at funeral for Daren Miller. Mapping out worship for January-May. Lenten planning beginning.

Stewardship and Management: No report.

Women of Grace: Christmas Luncheon will be Saturday, December 7. 81 tickets have been sold. Deep kitchen cleaning will be a part of spring and/or fall clean-up day.

Communications and Tech: No report.

Music Ministry: December music events are scheduled. Nick Fosheim is covering choir in the interim.

Faith and Family: Written report submitted. November was a month of planning for December events – Christmas program, Movie Night, Grace Kids Christmas party.

Parish Nurse: Written report submitted. Lots of hospital visits and follow up visits this month.

Youth & Young Adult: Written report submitted. Shopping for the Sharing Christmas families will be Thursday, December 5 at 6:30 pm. \$1500+ received for the project. Any remaining funds will go to DSS to provide gifts for foster children. Brian Penn will take a week of vacation following Christmas.

Executive: No additional items.

Church & Society: Have received hats and toys from the penitentiary for Ideal. Need more mittens and a driver to deliver. Karen Shea will do a temple talk to request.

Property: Submitted a written report. Added sump pump in north storage area. Had fire sprinkler system cleaned and sprinkler heads replaced. Repaired and serviced riding lawn mower so ready for spring. Started elevator shaft sump pump project.

Evangelism: No report.

Worship: Decorated the sanctuary for Advent and Christmas. Will sell poinsettias one more Sunday due to low attendance on Thanksgiving weekend due to the weather. Will provide breakfast for the choir on Cantata Sunday.


